What a year it has been! We have faced many delays that were out of our control in completing Phase Two of our project at Quiet Creek but I am excited to tell you that we finally opened the third special home, Smokey, this fall. This is our second home for cancer respite, individuals who need shelter in order to get lifesaving cancer treatment. we are committed to building

a community of care with multiple homes, calming and native landscaping and comfortable places to be outside. Landscaping started in

October and it is beginning to look really nice.

We have been able to care for 116 wonderful individuals through our hospice and cancer respite program. In 2022, we served 15 individuals -8 in our hospice program









and 7 in our cancer respite program. In 2023, we have alreadu served 26 individuals with our expansion.

We are very grateful for our community. Your support of our mission helps us focus on growing. Your support helps us have a strong compassionate team of staff and volunteers providing the best care for our residents. Thank you. I've recognized that our recurring donors—those who give monthly and quarterly—are the foundation for this growth and our sustainability. A pril Wilson got involved with Welcome Home for several reasons. She shares, "I believe wholeheartedly that every person deserves to have a safe place to lay their head. I also believe that every interaction

What motivates her to be a board member for Welcome Home is the intentional nature of what it stands for.
